Election attracts doctors to contest

THEY may come from divergent sides of politics but Mal Washer, re-elected long-serving Liberal member in West Australia, and Richard Di Natale, one of the Greens' new success stories, have at least two things in common — a commitment to improving health policies and a medical degree. They are just two of a contingent of doctors who contested the recent federal election, many of whom are also concerned about the environment.

Former general practitioner Dr Washer won the relatively safe Liberal seat of Moore to continue serving the electorate he has represented since 1998. Dr Washer has worked hard to raise awareness and improve the treatment of chronic disease and mental health and, he states on his website www.malwasher.com, he was behind the Coalition's election commitment to increase mental health funding. Dr Washer is also passionate about innovation, the environment and sustainability, and is a strong believer in the need for action on reducing carbon emissions.

Dr Di Natale easily secured a seat in the house of review to become the first Victorian Greens Senator-elect, after an unsuccessful attempt in the 2007 federal election. Dr Di Natale is a public health specialist who has spent several years working in Indigenous health in the Northern Territory and on HIV prevention in India.


Other Greens candidates included: Dr George Crisp, co-founder of the GreenPractice initiative, who stood for election in Bronwyn Bishop's electorate of Curtin; Dr Andrew Jeremijenko, an occupational and environmental medicine specialist who contested the relatively safe Labor seat of Lilley held by Wayne Swan; and Dr Geoff Couser, staff emergency specialist, lecturer and textbook author, in the seat

of Denison held safely by the Australian Labor Party's Duncan Kerr.

Doctors representing other parties included leading heart specialist and former president of the Art Gallery Society of NSW, Professor Michael Feneley, for the Liberals in Peter Garrett's seat of Kingsford Smith. Although the seat was held by the ALP as predicted, Professor Feneley had stated he wanted to provide a good alternative for people disappointed with the performance of the Minister for Environment Protection, Heritage and the Arts. For Labor, mid-north coast GP Frederick Lips contested the seat of Lyne, which has come into focus because of the success of the Member of Lyne since the 2008 by-election, independent Rob Oakeshott. Other parties fielding candidates from medicine included Family First, the Democratic Party of Australia, the Christian Democratic Party and Senator Online, which is dedicated to giving Australians a direct voice in Parliament.

Healthcare in disaster zones

Lessons learned from the Boxing Day tsunami

INTERNATIONAL disaster nursing is a new Australian publication — in conjunction with the World Association of Disaster and Emergency Medicine (WADEM) — looking at the work done by multidisciplinary teams in disaster regions. This comprehensive resource covers the diversity of issues that may be encountered, with experts, many of them Australian, contributing information on various topics. With the world coming to grips with an unprecedented catastrophe in Pakistan, there are no doubt aspects of this emergency that have commonalities with other recent disasters. Below are excerpts from a chapter by Elaine Daily, a former WADEM chair, on the Asian tsunami, looking at the challenges as well as lessons learned.

ON 26 DECEMBER 2004, one of the largest earthquakes in recent history occurred in the Indian Ocean off the west coast of northern Sumatra. The changes in the earth as a result of this large quake displaced vast volumes of water and generated the worst tsunami ever recorded. In some areas, almost all above-ground infrastructure was sucked into the ocean by the tsunami leaving enormous amounts of debris along the shoreline. The events resulted in a total of 224,983 deaths, 422,750 injured, and an estimated 1.2 million displaced persons.

CHALLENGES

The scope and magnitude of the combined events created challenges beyond the level usually encountered.

- ▶ Despite the fact that a surplus of relief supplies was sent to affected areas, a shortage of trucks to transport relief supplies, a widespread shortage of gasoline, and a lack of storage facilities resulted in the non-distribution of needed supplies.
- ▶ Many of the relief supplies, including medical supplies, were inappropriate to the events, climate, and/or culture; approximately two-thirds of the drugs provided were beyond their expiration date; labels were in foreign languages; and many were inappropriate for the circumstances. In addition, many of the relief teams came with supplies that did not include appropriate antibiotics to treat wounds and wound infections, the most commonly encountered medical needs.
- ▶ The collapse of local government, such as occurred in Aceh Province, resulted in a total lack of coordination mechanisms.
- ▶ Many affected areas were no longer accessible by road, and there was a shortage of helicopters to transport relief supplies to them.
- ▶ Many of the injured and dead victims were tourists from other countries, which posed logistical problems in terms of identification, communication, and transportation. Many of the foreign injured victims were transferred to their respective countries for care; this was managed and provided by their native country. Local citizens voiced complaints that the government gave more importance to rescue and relief efforts of tourists.
- ▶ The surviving children faced numerous risks. Many were orphaned and taken in by relatives or family friends; orphan siblings were sometimes separated; many faced the risk of being befriended by criminal gangs who would sell them to sex traffickers. In Sri Lanka, children faced the additional threat of landmines being dislodged by the tidal waves.
- ▶ The scope of the combined events resulted in mass numbers of fatalities that the affected countries were unprepared to handle. Most forensic identification was made using dental and fingerprint information. However, forensic capacity was insufficient, refrigeration was not available soon enough; dry ice and temporary, shallow, mass burials were techniques used to store large numbers of corpses.
- ▶ Victim identification was extremely challenging as proper storage of so many bodies for viewing and identification purposes was impossible. Photographs, video recordings, fingerprints, and basic personal information were relied upon for identification. However, within 24–48 hours after the event, decomposition began to distort the victims' features, making visual identification difficult.
- ▶ Temporary mass burials of victims occurred in most of the affected areas as a practical means of maintaining dead bodies in underground natural storage sites that were cooler than the ambient temperature; and
- ▶ The ongoing civil unrest in parts of Indonesia and Sri Lanka posed security concerns that restricted some relief in these areas. Prior to the earthquake and tsunami, humanitarian organisations had not been allowed into Banda Aceh, and safety issues remained a consideration after these events.

LESSONS LEARNED

- ▶ All countries and communities need to develop a preparedness plan for managing mass fatalities following disasters. This plan should detail: (1) recovery of the bodies; (2) transfer and storage of cadavers; (3) identification; and (4) final disposal of remains. Photographs, fingerprints, and dental comparisons are far easier and cheaper to use than are DNA analyses for victim identification.
- ▶ As has been noted previously, the presence of large numbers of dead bodies within communities did not result in the spread of any diseases.
- ▶ Guidelines are needed regarding how to treat the dead while respecting the rights of the survivors. Emphasis must be placed on respect and dignity.
- ▶ The surgical burden of injuries occurred in only the first few days after the events. However, medical and, in particular, primary care needs were the prominent medical issues thereafter.
- ▶ Needs assessment information obtained by members of any one organisation must be shared among all organisations to avoid duplicity in activities and resources. The initial distribution of essential supplies must be done according to the results of a thorough needs assessment.
- ▶ Input from and involvement of survivors in both relief and recovery interventions are essential. The presence of too many relief organisations may have a detrimental effect on the relief effort.
- ▶ National authority is needed to coordinate/direct national and international assistance within a country.
- ▶ All relief personnel, including the military, must be trained in cultural issues and sensitivities.
- ▶ Civil-military coordination and cooperation are essential to many relief efforts, and policies must

be established before an event.

- ▶ Mental health services must be involved in disaster planning and preparedness and must become active in both relief and recovery responses.

Q&A



MJA Careers profiles interesting and important jobs and the people who do them

Dr Meagan Brennan moved into the specific interest area of breast medicine more than a decade ago and has been working hard to help raise the profile of this important specialty. She juggles teaching and clinical positions with working towards a PhD, and even manages to find the time to walk the new puppy. With busy weekends focused on her family, life is hectic but never dull.

Name Meagan Brennan

Job title Breast physician, private practice
Staff Specialist breast physician, Westmead Hospital
Clinical Senior Lecturer, Northern and Western Clinical
Schools, University of Sydney

Time in position 11 years

What aspect of this job appealed to you most strongly when you applied or were appointed?

I was working in general practice and wanted to work in a special interest area. A large proportion of my practice was women's health so when the opportunity came up to train as a breast physician at the (then) Sydney Square Breast Clinic I applied for the position. The opportunity to learn new skills, including interventionist skills (breast biopsy), which I enjoy, was also attractive; and this work can lend itself very well to a part-time (as opposed to a full-time) load.

Career highlights? Any lowlights/disappointments you'd like to share?

I feel very passionate about my work. The most rewarding part is supporting women through the stress of undergoing diagnostic breast tests and treatment for breast cancer.

Highlights include becoming involved in academic and research work and seeing this field of clinical practice gain recognition. Another highlight has been the success in gaining staff specialist recognition for breast physicians in teaching hospitals and developing a credentialing pathway for this.

Among the very few disappointments, I find it frustrating that the profile of breast physicians is not increasing more quickly — I often have to explain to patients and to other doctors exactly what my role as a breast physician involves and what training I have had.

What have been the biggest surprises in your working life?

It's an exciting time to be involved in breast cancer diagnosis and treatment as there are constant advances in technology and treatment. There is also an increasing focus on the holistic approach to cancer care and breast physicians, with their GP background, are uniquely placed to be part of this.

And, I'm also surprised how much I enjoy teaching — helping patients understand their illness better is very rewarding, as is teaching students and junior doctors.

What do you hope to be doing — or have achieved — in five years' time?

My main goal is to finish the PhD — in survivorship care after breast cancer — that I have been working on for the past 2 years. I hope to continue both clinical and academic work and to be able to balance these better than I am at the moment. I also hope to establish positions at my centre for GPs who want to train as breast physicians.

What interests do you have outside medicine?

My life outside medicine is focused on my husband and our four young children, aged 5 to 12. Life is very hectic but never dull! As well as helping kids with homework and watching their sport, I try to make time to go walking with our new puppy most days.

Any career tips or suggestions for young doctors interested in this field?

I would encourage interested GPs to train and work as a breast physician. Although there is a current lack of formal training positions, anyone who is interested in taking up this work should speak to a breast physician or contact the Australasian Society of Breast Physicians.

I would also encourage GPs to become involved in research and teaching. As well as being very rewarding, it helps GPs gain more recognition for their important contribution.

If I could change one thing in the world of medicine or research it would be ...

I would like to improve access to breast diagnostic and treatment services for women in outer suburban and rural areas, and from lower socioeconomic, migrant and Indigenous groups.

I can see the great service that women get in the parts of Sydney where I practise and I am aware that we as clinicians and our patients are very lucky — many clinicians are struggling to provide basic services and women are struggling to access them in other parts of Australia.
